South Lamar Rescue Squad Bruce Patrick Public Relations Officer

We all as volunteers of the Alabama Association of Rescue Squads donate a lot of our time helping others. Often we do not take time to take good care of ourselves. Regular yearly medical check ups help you to ensure your health is good and alert you to any unseen problems in your body. Our ladies have to keep check for Breast Cancer and our men need to keep check for Prostate Cancer. Prostate Cancer is the silent killer of men. This information is so very important for you to ensure this cancer if present will not lead into non treatable cancers in other body parts.

Prostate Cancer – Not just the Old Mans Cancer

Did you know Prostate Cancer is projected to strike one in every six men? The Prostate Cancer Foundation predicts 242,000 new cases of Prostate Cancer in 2012.

I am Bruce Patrick and I want to share some facts about prostate cancer.

The most active cancer in men is skin cancer. The second most active men's cancer is prostate cancer. Prostate cancer has been called the "Old Mans Cancer" and the "Silent Killer Cancer in Men". This is because a man often does not know that he has this cancer until it spreads to other body organs. Prostate cancer can be a slow acting cancer that is detected in men above the age of 65. It can also show up in men 45 and older. The best way to know if you have a risk of prostate cancer is to have a blood sample taken and a PSA test preformed. The prostate-specific antigen (PSA) is a blood substance that often increases in patients with prostate cancer and other prostate diseases. A normal PSA value would be 0 to 3.5. If over time this test is in the 3.6 to 4.0 range other test are needed. A digital rectal examination and a prostate biopsy (tissue samples are removed from the prostate for cancer cell testing)

This is the high risk group for prostate cancer: you have a close relative that has had prostate cancer or being of African-American descent. If you have several close relatives with prostate cancer start PSA test at age 40.

My prostate cancer was detected in the spring of 2006. My PSA had elevated to 3.9 with no pain or any signs of a problem. My prostate biopsy was a small needle sample from 8 sections of my prostate. Four of the 8 sections had early cancers growing in the prostate gland. My age was 56 years old and I had the prostate removed March 30, 2006. I had robotic prostrate surgery, removing the prostate and the lymph node glands next to it. The blessing to this event is 2 weeks after the surgery I was back to work at a 100%. We found it early enough that no cancer was found outside the prostate. I did not have to take any radiation therapy. My yearly PSA test is 0.0 for the past 6 years.

My message to men in the age groups 45 and above and the higher risk groups at 40 is this. Do the PSA blood test each year and keep track of your PSA readings. If it starts to climb too fast get further medical test. Do this to take care of yourself. Do this so you can be around to take care of your family. It is reported a lot of other cancers in men started in the prostate and was detected after it had spread from the prostate. Often these cancers in other organs have grown to a cancer that can not be cured.

There is a big debate surrounding prostate cancer. Some doctors say it a disease that you can live with and no PSA test or exam is needed. I say any sign of cancer in your body is a wake up call, a message to you. If you do not get it checked out, it can grow until it kills you.


