Your skills, your ability to perform, your commitment to the community and the need to keep yourself ready for all emergency situation you are called on for assistance. It is a wonderful thing to be a part of an organized Rescue Squad and to have a bright colored T-Shirt to prove you are a First Responder that provides life saving skills for the community. You are a skilled highly trained individual and looked upon by many as a hero in many cases.

Now I ask, are you ready? When was the last time you trained or renewed your much needed skills in the many you possess! Are you certain that you can respond to your full potential to save the life of the person in dyer need of that technical rescue situation? I can assure you that we as members of the Lower Alabama Search and Rescue will do our best to meet all needed training required to be proficient in the skills needed to respond when called upon for assistance. It is a great responsibility we take on and we are serious about training in this organization. All team leaders provide quality training events throughout the year and expect our members to attend and keep their skills honed to a sharp edge. This provides this unit with highly skilled members and consistently upgraded procedures to serve the community and our fellow AARS member Squads throughout the state of ALABAMA.

Medical training provided by inhouse CPR/AED instructors and EMS medical instructors and by attending off site medical training when available.

Dive Team members conduct routine training and fun dive events simulated search and recovery training is conducted multiple times each year. Dive tinder certification and PSD training is paramount for our members by our inhouse PSD Certified instructors. Boat team members work closely with dive team for support with dive operations when needed. Team members are all required to have boater safety certification and to complete formal training on all the different rescue vessels within the unit. All vessel operators recertify yearly and conduct boat inspections before and after every event.

Land SAR teams conduct map reading, GPS, ATV/UTV training and simulated training scenarios on a routine basis.

Drone team conducts pilot and observer training classroom and hands-on events to keep our members current in requirements and with the FAA requirements and Air Space restrictions to flight operations for training and actual Mission needs.

High angle rope team, conducts knots and rope classes rigging classes and high tower training and certification classes by our in house Alpine certified and repel master Instructors. All training is conducted to provide excellent and proficient team members for high angle rescue as needed for any event.

We are far from being a perfect squad, but we do our best to be highly qualified and do the training to hopefully keep our skills and ability ready for all possible mission we may be requested to respond to in support of our community and fellow squads of the AARS!

Operations and Command support teams conduct training for mission requirements and communications within the command bus and team support along with multiple agency and ICS operations for mission events.
