#### AARS MEETING MINUTES 1st Quarterly meeting, Mobile, AL February 18, 2023

Meeting was called to order by President Danny Butler.

Roll call was done by Johnny Warren.

A motion was made by Desoto Rescue Squad to dispense with the reading of the minutes from the 2022 AARS conference. Motion was seconded by Autauga County. Motion passed. In the general business meeting East Colbert made the motion to dispense and it was seconded by Desoto Rescue and passed. Financial report was read as follows by Johnny Warren:

\*General Fund - \$53,245.35

\*Conference account - \$46,082.83

\*Ad Valorem account - \$128,280.98 \*Benevolent account - \$4,394.68 \*Investment account - \$83,401.22

\*Total - \$315,405.06

A motion was made by Desoto Rescue Squad to accept the financial report as read. Motion was seconded by Etowah County. Motion passed. In the general business meeting East Colber made a motion to dispense with the reading of the financial report. It was seconded by Desoto Rescue and motion passed. President Danny Butler announced the other new officers, 1st Vice President, Brian Bailey, and 2nd Vice Presi-

dent, Ray Hogans. Debbie Tidwell remains as Executive Secretary/Treasurer.

1st Vice President Brian Bailey presented two new squads for acceptance into the AARS. The first squad presented was County Line Volunteer Rescue Squad from Talladega County. Danny Butler inspected them and they met all the AARS requirements. A motion was made by Desoto Rescue Squad to accept for membership. Motion was seconded by LASAR. Motion passed. In the general business meeting Athens/Limestone made the motion to accept and it was seconded by Marengo. Motion passed.

The second squad presented was Dual River Rescue Squad from Blount County. Danny had inspected them also and they met all the AARS requirements. Blount County Rescue Squad made a motion that Dual River be denied membership in the AARS due to alleged previous ethical issues with the current chief of Dual River. Chauncey Wood pointed out that we needed to go into Executive Session to discuss the good name and character of someone. Motion was made by Childersburg and seconded by Geraldine to go into Executive Session.

Motion carried. (Executive Session held - no minutes)

(Executive Session closed)

Blount County's motion to deny Dual River admission into the AARS died for lack of a second. A motion to accept Dual River was made by Carbon Hill and seconded by Mobile EMS. Motion passed. In the general business meeting Athens/Limestone made the motion to accept and it was seconded by East Colbert. Motion passed. Brian announced that 5 drones had already been passed out and a new grant would give the AARS 6 more drones available. He asked any squads who might be interested in having a drone to apply

2nd Vice President Ray Hogans told all squads how important it was to be certain your squad was 100% NIMS compliant because it was needed for funding through both the state and federal government.

Ray also announced training classes scheduled in Morgan Co. and Childersburg that were open to any squad, that he is working on state certification for instructor's and that there would be K-9 training June 10th and 11th at Blakely State Park for any squads interested.

Ray also said that he was working on Fall training as well as Conference training and that anyone who had any classes they would like to have at conference to let him know.

Danny Smith reported that the Ways & Means Committee had awarded grants totaling \$16,581. Two more grants were tabled because of missing information but it was anticipated those would be awarded as well. The combined total of grants was \$24,681. More grants will be available in August. A motion was made by Randolph Co and seconded by Carbon Hill to accept. Motion carried.

In the Legislative Report, Chauncey reported that a bill has been introduced to amend Bill 2018-524, the Volun-teer Rescue Student bill. The proposed bill would amend to include program fees and other expenses and to add ambulance services and also to drop the mandatory stay to 2 years from 3 years.

Chauncey also reported that he is continuing to work on getting annual funding for rescue squads.

Matt Knight spoke about ARPA money and ambulance services receiving some of that money and the possibility that if there is left over money is might go to rescue squads. Chauncey then gave an update on the loaner program.

Danny Butler reported that Jeff Randall who had been appointed as training officer for the AARS had resigned. Anyone interested in the position should send a resume to the Executive Board.

Danny also stressed the importance of keeping up with your squads statistics, as far as calls run, and that the AARS was working on a way to make that easier.

There was discussion about the all call system and that it needed some changes and improvements. Matt Knight was presented with a Lifetime Achievement Award as he had not been at conference to get it then. In Old Business, Mike Hardy questioned why new class A uniforms for the Honor Guard had not been provided yet because they had been approved years ago. Danny agreed that they would look into it and figure out why. The next meeting would be May 20, 2023 at Athens/Limestone.

Meeting was adjourned.




